AIR TRANSPORT CIRCULAR AT 02/2020

USE OF "HEALTH DECLARATION FORM" FOR THE PURPOSE OF HEALTH SCREENING FOR NOVEL CORONA VIRUS (2019-NCOV)

02nd February 2020

I.0 Introduction

World Health Organization (WHO) has declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) on the spread of novel coronavirus (nCoV) in China and across the globe. In response to the PHEIC, the Health Protection Agency (HPA) of the Maldives has introduced a "Health Declaration Card" to be filled by all passengers and crew to further minimise the risk of import and spread of the disease.

The information collected through the Card will assist the authorities to manage the public health event, to trace passengers who may have been exposed to the disease, and to make arrangements to provide early treatment for them while safeguarding others around them.

2.0 Purpose

2.1 The purpose of this Circular is to instruct all international airlines and international general aviation and private flights operating to and from Maldives, and the relevant airport authorities about the dissemination and distribution of Health Declaration Card to arriving passengers and to provide information the card to passengers by an inflight announcement.

3.0 Requirement

- 3.1 All international flights operating to and from Maldives are required to distribute to passengers and crew the Health Declaration Card appended hereto as Attachment A, prior to landing.
- 3.2 All arriving passengers and crew are required to complete Card before proceeding the Immigration counters.
- 3.3 The following announcement should be made inflight after the distribution of the Card in English and in Chinese languages;

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"The Health Protection Agency of Maldives requires all passengers and crew, including Maldivians to fill out the Health Declaration Card, which has been provided to you. Please fill out all the information. Health Declaration Cards are also available at the arrival terminal and are to be submitted to Immigration on arrival".

- 3.4 The actions (3.1 and 3.3) must be properly recorded in the health section of the General Declaration (GD) and shall be submitted to International Border Health or Health Officer at respective airports.

4.0 Applicability

4.1 The requirements in this Circular applies to all international airlines, international general aviation and private flights operating to and from Maldives.

5.0 Effectivity

5.1 The Circular will come into effect from 02 February 2020, and will remain inforce until rescinded or superseded.

Novel Corona Virus Related Information PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

A. In the last 14 days have you visited China and if you

- have been in close contact with a confirmed case of 2019 novel coronavirus
- or
- have worked at or attended a health facility where patients with hospital-associated 2019-novel coronavirus infections have been reported
- or
 - worked as a health care worker in an environment where severe acute respiratory infections of were cared for
- or
- visited Hubei province (China)

AND

B. If you develop any of the following symptoms:

Fever (greater than ≥38°C or 100.4 °F)

Cough Runny nose Breathing difficulty Sore throat

What you should do

- If you do not speak English, seek help from the hotel front desk/Border Health desk and ask them to call the 7377004 (Corona virus HOTLINE)
- If you can speak English/Dhivehi Please call 7377004 (Corona virus HOTLINE) and inform them of your situation, do not worry, the hotline operators will get you the help you need
- 3. Do not go outside, and stay in your room
- 4. Other people should refrain from going to your room
- 5. Wear a surgical mask over your nose and mouth
- 6. Maintain a 3-foot distance from other people
- You may take Panadol/paracetamol for symptoms like fever/headache/body aches. Do not take any other medicines without a doctors advise. Drink plenty of fluids and rest
