The Scoring System is based on academic merit, aptitude tests and a formal interview. A total of 50% is allocated for academic merit. A total of 25% is allocated for aptitude tests and a total of 25% is allocated for the interview.

1. Points are given to the best six O level and best 3 A Level unless there is a tie where points will be given to all subjects.
2. For Diplomas, points are given to all grades obtained as above and the sum is divided by no. of subjects taken and then finally converted to a score out of 15.
