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Air Safety Circular Maldives Civil Aviation Authority ASC OPS 11 Flight Attendant Requirements

FLIGHT ATTENDANT REQUIREMENTS

1. Regulatory Compliance

The Maldives Civil Aviation Authority (MCAA) is responsible for the development of air operations regulations and to bring out appropriate standards to be complied by the air operators.

Henceforth, the Maldives Civil Aviation Authority, in exercise of the powers conferred on it under articles 5 and 6 of the Maldives Civil Aviation Authority Act 2/2012 brings out this circular cited as ASC OPS 11.

Compliance with this Circular is mandatory for all relevant Maldivian air operators.

2. Related Regulations

Related regulations include MCAR Aircrew, MCAR Air Operations.

3. Purpose

The purpose of this Circular is to establish additional minimum requirements for flight attendants that shall be met and satisfied by all air operators. This Air Safety Circular replaces the previous Circular on flight attendant requirements dated 15th June 2003.

4. Introduction

Cabin crew members who form part of the crew of the aircraft engaged in commercial air operations have to perform a wide variety of duties of which the most important being the safety of passengers. This Circular sets out the minimum requirement of cabin attendants and their training requirements.

5. Flight Attendant Requirements

(1) Subject to subsection (3), no air operator shall operate an aircraft with passengers on board unless the crew includes at least the following number of flight attendants:

- (a) 1 to 50 passengers on board, one attendant;
- (b) 51 to 100 passengers on board, two attendants; and
- (c) 101 or more passengers on board, one attendant for each unit of 50 passengers or portion thereof.

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(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), no air operator shall operate an aircraft with passengers on board with fewer flight attendants than the number required to satisfy the following requirements:

- (a) The air operator shall, for each type and model of aircraft that it operates, assign to each flight attendant the duties to be performed in an emergency, including an emergency evacuation, and shall show that the performance of those duties adequately meets any emergency that may be reasonably anticipated, including the possible incapacitation of another flight attendant; and
- (b) The air operator shall ensure that the duties assigned pursuant to paragraph (a) are described in its company operations manual.

(3) An air operator may operate an aircraft with passengers on board with a crew that includes fewer than the minimum number of flight attendants required by subsection (1), if the air operator is authorized to do so in its Air Operator Certificate.

(4) Where an aircraft has more than one deck, the number of flight attendants on each deck shall be in accordance with subsections (1) and (2).

6. Designation of In-charge Flight Attendant

An air operator shall, where a crew includes more than one flight attendant, designate an incharge flight attendant.

7. Flight Attendant Qualifications

(1) No air operator shall permit a person to act and no person shall act as a flight attendant on board an aircraft unless the person;-

(a) has successfully completed the air operator's training program, except that a person may act as a flight attendant while undergoing line indoctrination training if the person is carried in addition to the number of flight attendants required in paragraph 1 and is under the supervision of a flight attendant;

(b) has successfully completed line indoctrination training or regained competency in accordance with the Maldives Civil Aviation Regulations and as per the air operator's training program;

(c) has successfully completed the cabin crew general examinations given by the Maldives Civil Aviation Authority (MCAA);

(d) holds a current aviation medical certificate issued by a Maldives Civil Aviation Authority approved Medical Examiner; and

(e) Must be at least 18 year of age.

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8. Training Program

(1) Every air operator shall establish and maintain a training program that is

- (a) designed to ensure that each person who receives training acquires the competence to perform the person's assigned duties; and
- (b) approved by the Maldives Civil Aviation Authority in accordance with the Maldives Civil Aviation Regulations.

9. Flight Attendant Manual

(1) Every air operator, other than an air operator that is authorized solely for the transport of cargo in its Air Operator Certificate, shall establish and maintain, as part of its company operations manual, a flight attendant manual for the use and guidance of flight attendants in the operation of its aircraft.

(2) A flight attendant manual shall contain the instructions and information necessary to enable flight attendants to perform their duties safely and shall contain the information required by the Maldives Civil Aviation Regulations.

(3) An air operator shall provide a copy of its flight attendant manual, including any amendments to that manual, to each of its flight attendants.

(4) Every flight attendant who has been provided with a copy of a flight attendant manual pursuant to subsection (4) shall keep it up to date with the amendments provided and shall ensure that the appropriate parts are accessible when the flight attendant is performing assigned duties on board an aircraft.

10. Effectivity

This Air Safety Circular comes into effect on 11th August 2022.
